## Incident log

## Reduce pressure

- Add separate resources before forcing interaction.
- Create escape routes and visual breaks.
- Avoid shared feeding pressure.
- Use gradual reintroduction after serious conflict.

## Call for help

- Seek veterinary or behavior help for injuries, sudden aggression, blocked access to food/litter, or conflict that worsens despite resource changes.
